# Weight Assessment and Counseling for Nutrition and Physical Activity for Children/Adolescents (WCC)

## **Description of Measure**

The percentage of members 3 – 21 years of age who had at least one comprehensive well-care visit with a PCP or an OB/GYN practitioner during the measurement year (MY).

### **Documentation**

- The well-care visit must occur with a PCP or an OB/GYN practitioner, but the practitioner does not have to be the practitioner assigned to the member.
- Well-care visits must be at least 14 days apart.
- Comprehensive well-care visit includes a health history, physical exam, physical and mental developmental history, and anticipatory guidance.
- Documentation of handouts given without evidence of discussion does not meet criteria.
- Preventive services may be rendered on visits other than well-care visits. Medical record must include documentation of preventative services.

## **Strategies for Success**

- Prevent missed opportunities by taking advantage of every office visit (including sick visits) to provide a well
  child visit, immunizations, developmental screening, lead testing, and topical fluoride for children.
- Ensure that medical records include the date that a health and developmental history, physical exam was performed, and what health education/anticipatory guidance was given.
- Use standardized templates in charts and in electronic medical records (EMRs) that allow checkboxes for standard counseling activities.
- Follow the American Academy of Pediatrics Bright Futures: Guidelines for Health Supervision of Infants,
   Children and Adolescents schedule.
- Educate staff to schedule the recommended AAP visits within the guidelines time frames.
- Educate staff to schedule the next visit or more visits prior to leaving the office.
